Paddington Bear

Create a bear who shares his name with the train station UK royalty first travelled to from Slough

Slough Museum background information:

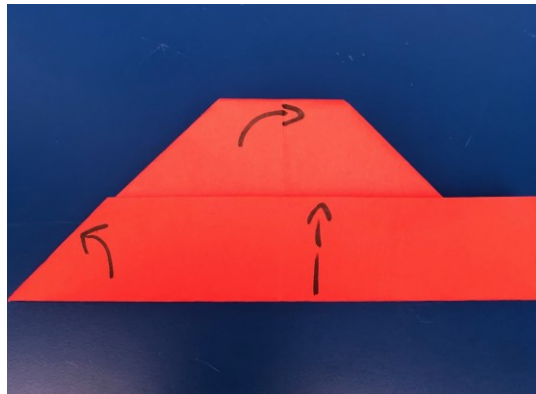
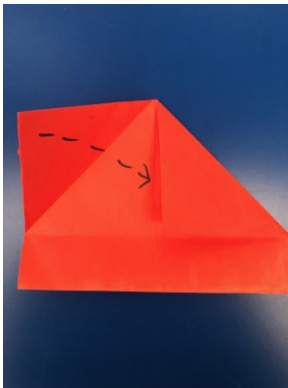
Slough Museum's Victorian Slough Pod is on the second floor of The Curve. The Pod tells how Queen Victoria was the first British monarch to travel by train from Slough Train Station in 1842. She journeyed to Paddington Station in London – but did she find and look after this bear?

You will need:

- A toilet roll inside
- Red paper and blue paper/felt/fabric – although you can use white paper and colour it in
- Scissors and glue with optional toggle/bead and badge for coat

How to make:

- 1) Cut a piece of A4 red paper in half (making it A5) fold it in half and half again. Then open it up once and with the fold at the top and the paper opening at the bottom fold both sides into the middle line, making a pyramid shape with a paper strip below.
- 2) Fold the paper strip up, turn over and fold the paper strip up on the other side. Fold the edges in and the top down to make Paddington's hat.



- 3) Snip at the toilet roll base to make little feet & add paw claw lines + nose, mouth & eyes.
- 4) Cut the blue 'coat' to size, allowing the paws and face to show and fold down 'lapels'.
